January 17, 2024 - The Massachusetts Women of Color Coalition (MAWOCC) will host its Annual Meeting and Celebration featuring keynote speaker Representative Brandy Fluker Oakley and a legislative panel discussion with Congressman James McGovern and Senator Robyn Kennedy on Saturday, January 20th from 12:30 to 4:30 p.m. at College of the Holy Cross Hogan Center, 1 College Street in Worcester.

Fluker Oakley, Esq. is a State Representative for the 12th Suffolk District serving parts of Dorchester, Hyde Park, Mattapan, and Milton. She serves as the House Co-Chair of the Ellen Story Commission on Postpartum Depression, Vice-Chair of the Racial Equity, Civil Rights, and Inclusion Committee, and is a member of The Judiciary Committee, the Transportation Committee, and the Revenue Committee. Fluker Oakley also serves on the Women's Caucus executive board as Treasurer and is an engaged member of the MA Black and Latino Legislative Caucus.
